The correct title of the programme is Bachelor's of Law LLB (Hons). We have made amendments to pages – Cover Page, 4, 8 and 17. Find attached pages.

**Point Five** 

This had been discussed with London Metropolitan University during the Course Approval Panel

Evaluation. After discussions with the panel and programme leaders London Metropolitan University

suggested that we do not provide optional modules, only core modules. Please feel free to confirm

with London Metropolitan University course leader.

**Point Six** 

City Unity College has three full-time faculty members (shown in the ERGANI database – attached) who

will teach, once approved, in the Bachelor's of Law LLB (Hons) programme. Please note that the

programme, once approved by DIPAE, will run in October 2024. We have consent from the remaining

faculty members that once the programme is approved we will proceed to offer a teaching position in

the above mentioned programme of study. The current full time faculty members assigned to the

programme are sufficient to teach the first semester of the programme upon commencing in October

2024. The college could decide to employ more faculty given the enrolment figures closer to the start

of the academic year 2024-2025.

**Point Seven** 

Attached we have included the current teaching periods per week of the full-time faculty members.

Please note, once the Bachelor's of Law LLB (Hons) programme is approved the college will ensure that

all accredited programme academic faculty will have an even distribution of their teaching workload.

We have always had our full-time and part-time academic faculty members (name and rank) uploaded

onto our website, we have amended the current position to show they are faculty of City Unity College.

All short CV's as required by DIPAE have been prepared and are further attached.

In accordance with the provisions of Laws of 2015 to 2021 [L. 136 (I)/2015 - L. 132(I)/2021], I have instructions to inform you in regards to the findings of the **preliminary review**, carried out by CYQAA, for the programs of study **Bachelor's of Law (LLB) - (3 years, 180 ECTS, Bachelor degree)**, of the institution London Metropolitan University, UK which will be offered via the franchise method by your institution, City Unity College, Nicosia.

In your letter of reply, you should include, in accordance with the above-mentioned Law, all the information that the Agency has identified as deficient or missing in the preliminary review.

It is expected that your response will be structured, and you will reply with specific references to documentation (annexes and pages) in accordance to the Agency's Law.

### During the preliminary review we have observed the following:

- 1. The **programme's title** is incorrect (Cover Letter, cover page n.4, doc. 200.4). According to the London Metropolitan University's instructions, the correct title of the programme is the: **Bachelor's of Law LLB (Hons)**, (ANNEX 1).
- 2. On page 1 INSTITUTION'S CHECK LIST "In order for your request to be forwarded and properly examined, you must confirm that the following have been delivered at CYQAA's offices (check √ where applicable):"
  - On the checklist, point 9 <u>was not completed</u> although the information was submitted on page 245 of your application, under section 4. Admissions.
- 3. On pages 6 & 7 & 8 The confirmation of the 'UK QAA recognition that London Metropolitan University has degree awarding powers' **web page** *cannot be found*.
- 4. On page 7 The 'Programme Rankings: Number **29** on Guardian University Rankings' is incorrect, the correct programme ranking number is **85**, according to your documentation (<a href="https://www.theguardian.com/education/ng-interactive/2023/sep/09/the-guardianuniversity-guide-2024-the-rankings">https://www.theguardian.com/education/ng-interactive/2023/sep/09/the-guardianuniversity-guide-2024-the-rankings</a>).
- 5. City Unity College does not offer the students any optional modules like the London Metropolitan University does, but only core modules are listed under "Module Specifications and Evaluation", page 61.
- 6. Your institution's full-time faculty number is low, according to the Guidelines of the Agency. At this point we also need to inform you that the CYQAA, during the '99th Council Summit', decided that institutions are required to additionally send the list of their academic staff to the ERGANI database and also submit proof of social insurance payment for all academic staff who teach in the programme.
- 7. Furthermore, in order for the Agency to assure that the quality of the programs of study is not compromised by any excess in the weekly teaching load of the academics, you need to submit the **total number** of teaching periods per week, for each academic/teacher and for each programme they are a part of, at City Unity College Nicosia. Additionally, **all** academics' profiles (name and rank) should be uploaded to your website, including part time staff, and their **CV's** should be updated so that their position at your College can be in view, under their current professional experience. In addition, from the requested <u>Data</u>, some of the Teaching Staff's **Short CV's** are missing (Doc. 500.01.03/500.01.04, TABLE A: TEACHING STAFF).

Buses: Just in front of the college, at 19, Stasinou Str. Engomi, Nicosia, students can use the bus network to any direction and destination in the city and province of Nicosia and Cyprus in general as well. Buses are not consistent in appearance, though the destination is usually displayed in the windscreen. Bus time tables and schedules are available from tourist offices or directly from the bus companies. Be aware that services stop early daily (at approximately 18:00) and there is limited bus service on weekends (some areas have no service on Sundays).

Bus fare is paid directly to the bus driver; exact change is required. Shared and private taxi services provide an alternative method of transport with the options being Island-wide



bus services, urban buses, rural buses, intercity taxis, urban taxis and rural taxis.

#### **Student Code of Conduct**

#### Purpose

The purpose of the Code of Student Conduct (the Code) is to define the responsibility of all City Unity College Nicosia students to act in a manner that respects the rights, safety and wellbeing of others. The intent of the Code is to provide a framework to resolve issues when civility and respect for the rights of others break down and informal resolution is not possible. These principles and values can only be realized in an atmosphere of respect, safety and security.

In the context of the Code, the goal and responsibility of City Unity College Nicosia is to provide an academic community encompassing all aspects of college life, such that the pursuit of education and personal growth can take place in a safe and welcoming environment. The Code includes coverage of incidents that occur on campus, which affect the City Unity College Nicosia workplace, living and study environment.

#### Scope

The Code applies to full-time and part-time (prospective or confirmed) student conduct from the time of application or registration in a program or course through to completion of the course or graduation from the program, where activities or actions are a component of the relationship between the student and the institution, or between community members.

#### **Student Union**

The acts as a means of communication between the College and its students. It is autonomous and its actions are based on the official student union constitution.

#### **DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:**

Promote general welfare of students



- Act as the official organisation representing all students attending/enrolled at City Unity College Nicosia
- Develop and fosters the cultural, intellectual, social and athletic recreation of students
- Enhance communication between its members and the College
- Elect the Union Committee: President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, Public Relations, Two Members
- Appoint members as representatives of College committees

All City Unity College Nicosia community members have rights that are protected under the Cyprus Human Rights Code as well as the European Charter of Rights and Freedoms. These rights are subject to limitations as described by law and some activities (rights) that are acceptable in a public place may not be appropriate in certain contexts in an institution of higher education.

All students have a responsibility to be aware of policies and codes that guide expectations of conduct in the various environments where students engage in college- related activity. It is expected that community members will treat each other with mutual respect and in a way that does not adversely affect the rights of others. Where this expectation is violated and not resolvable informally, formal processes will be engaged. Students will be held accountable for the behavior of their guests under this Code.

#### **Academic Advising**

At City Unity College Nicosia academic advising is a shared process between the student and the academic advisor which enables students to explore and achieve educational, life and career goals.

#### To Achieve This Students Will:

- Value the role of the academic advising process as part of the college Experience
- Demonstrate the characteristics of a prepared advisee by bringing questions and material for discussion to advising sessions
- Develop an educational plan for successfully achieving their goals
- Use campus resources and services to assist them in achieving their academic, personal and career goals
- Follow through when referred to appropriate campus resources
- Be able to accurately read and effectively use a degree audit in their educational planning
- Complete educational goals in a timely manner based on the educational plan.



#### Academic Advisor Responsibilities

- Effectively communicate the curriculum and graduation requirements for the student's major per college academic policies and procedures.
- Assist students in the pre-registration process which may include checking for course pre-requisites and interpretation of college test scores.
- Encourage and guide students as they define and develop realistic goals.
- Encourage and support students as they make academic progress according to their educational plans.
- Provide students with information about strategies for using the available resources and services on campus.
- Assist students in understanding the purposes and goals of higher education and its effects on their lives and personal goals.
- Be accessible for advising students during posted office hours, or by telephone, email, or web access.
- Assist students in gaining decision-making skills and learning to assume responsibility for their educational plans and achievements.
- Maintain confidentiality.
- Assist students in working closely with their instructors and refer students to appropriate college sources when assistance is needed.

#### Advisee Responsibilities

- Schedule regular appointments and make regular contact with advisor during each semester.
- Keep all scheduled advising appointments
- Come prepared to each appointment with questions or materials for discussion.
- Be an active learner by participating fully in the advising experience.
- Ask questions if you do not understand an issue or have a specific concern.
- Enroll in the courses which you and your advisor have determined appropriate and follow-through with these courses.
- Keep a personal record of your progress toward meeting your goals. Use an audit sheet to track class completions.
- Organize official documents (transcripts, etc.) in an advising folder that will enable you to access them when needed.
- Complete all assignments or recommendations from your advisor.
- Clarify personal values and goals and provide your advisor with accurate information regarding your interests and abilities.
- Become knowledgeable about college programs, policies, and procedures.
- Accept responsibility for your decisions.



#### Orientation

Orientation, employment and career services and assistance with finding accommodation are just a few of the services offered to students at all stages of their College life by the Office of Student Affairs. Moreover, the Office of Student Affairs organizes and sponsors many extra-curricular programs and activities, which aim at enhancing students' life at City Unity College Nicosia. Student life is an important aspect of college education as it can offer a unique opportunity to develop leadership and communication skills. The Office of Student Affairs tries to cultivate a feeling of shared responsibility whereby students can learn the importance of teamwork and become members of an international community. A very important part of the orientation for a student is getting to know the role of a student advisor.
