Point One

We have made the amendment on page 1 – point number 9 Expected number of students for each year (the institution must submit the exact number of students per semester) – checkbox ticked – find attached page.

Pages 6, 7 and 9 site link has been corrected –

Point Three

We agree with the observation that indeed the programme ranking of the above mentioned course is 61st and not 29th on the Guardian University Rankings site.

All student services can be viewed in our Student Orientation Handbook attached.

Point Five

The academic faculty in Table A: Teaching Staff page 14 are all ranked as lecturers because they will be

initially hired to teach in this new programme due to run in October 2024, when approved by CYQAA.

According to our internal regulations each faculty member must undergo a six-month probation period

in which time he/she will hold the rank of lecturer. Upon completion of the probation period the

ranking committee will decide on the final rank of each academic faculty member. According to the

decision of the CYQAA Council during the 99th Council Summit proof of social insurance payment must

be provided for all academic faculty who teach in the programme. As this programme is currently

undergoing review by CYQAA to run for the first time in October 2024, the faculty involved in this

programme will be hired in due course depending on the outcome of its approval. Given the approval

of the CYQAA the College will submit the relevant documentation of the academic faculty's proof of

social insurance payments.

Point Six

As mentioned in Point 5 (above) due to the fact the this is a new programme with new academic faculty

members, the teaching workload which appears in Table A: Teaching Staff page 14 will be held.

Currently the potential academic faculty CV's submit are not updated to include the employment at

City Unity College due to the fact that they are not yet employed at the College, pending approval of

the programme by CYQAA by which time their CV's will be uploaded onto the College's website

accordingly. Find attached the prepared short CV's in accordance of CYQAA's request.

The modules appearing in Year 3 have been sent to us by London Metropolitan University and they are

correct according to the paperwork we have submitted. Please find attached the Module Core Request

form that was sent to us by London Metropolitan University confirming the above.

Attached you will find the London Metropolitan University awarding body degree certificate sample.

Mr. Stephen Breen (s.breen@londonmet.ac.uk) FHEA MBCS, Principal Lecturer/ Head of Collaborative Partnerships SCDM / Academic Liaison Tutor at London Metropolitan University – BSc Computing liaison has not accepted to send his staffs CV's. We have informed CYQAA verbally regarding this matter on two occasions. Should CYQAA require the London Metropolitan CV's from the Computing department, please make a formal request as we have been denied. Mr. Breen's department academic staff are solely concerned with GDPR regulation and the movement of personal data.

SUBJECT: Preliminary review regarding the programme of study "BSc (Hons) Computing", which is going to be offered by the City Unity College Nicosia, via the franchise method, in collaboration with the London Metropolitan University, UK

Based on the Law [N. 136 (I) / 2015 to 35 (I) 2021], I have instructions to inform you in regards to the findings of the **preliminary review**, carried out by CYQAA, for the programs of study **BSc (Hons) Computing - (3 years, 180 ECTS, Bachelor degree)**, of the institution London Metropolitan University, UK which will be offered via the franchise method by your institution, City Unity College, Nicosia.

In your letter of reply, you should include, in accordance with the above-mentioned Law, all the information that the Agency has identified as deficient or missing in the preliminary review.

It is expected that your response will be structured, and you will reply with specific references to documentation (annexes and pages) in accordance to the Agency's Law.



Observations during the preliminary review:

- 1. On page 1 INSTITUTION'S CHECK LIST "In order for your request to be forwarded and properly examined, you must confirm that the following have been delivered at CYQAA's offices (check $\sqrt{\text{where applicable}}$):"
 - On the checklist, point 9 <u>was not completed</u> although the information was submitted on page 218 of your application, under section 4.Admissions.
- 2. On pages 6 & 7 & 8 The confirmation of the 'UK QAA recognition that London Metropolitan University has degree awarding powers' web page cannot be found.
- 3. On page 7 The 'Programme Rankings: Number **29** on Guardian University Rankings' appears to be incorrect. Since on the relevant website, it is ranked: **Ranked 61st in subject**, according to your documentation (https://www.theguardian.com/education/ng-interactive/2023/sep/09/the-guardianuniversity-guide-2024-the-rankings).
- 4. On page 11 Part (b) "Complete evidence for the academic facilities and services to be offered by the educational institute as well as those offered by the educational institute whose degree title will be awarded".
 - In regards with the above point, in your documentation, you refer only to the building facilities which are offered by the collaborating institution. It is required to provide documentation on all facilities, including **infrastructures and services for students** that will be offered by your institution City Unity College Nicosia, in the same way as they are offered by London Metropolitan University. Such examples are, Counselling Service support and personal development (e.g. school offices that can help students' access to advice and guidance from staff, from financial issues to careers, The Students' Union, etc.).
- 5. On page 14 Part A: TEACHING STAFF OF THE BSc (Hons) Computing programme, you provide a nominal list of the teaching staff of your institution. In your list, all of the teaching staff appear to be at the rank of Lecturers. The Agency would like to highlight that recruiting qualified staff is a prerequisite for running successful programmes of study. Please, do submit more information on this matter. The CYQAA Council, during the 99th Council Summit, decided that institutions will be required to additionally send the list of their academic staff extracted from the ERGANI database and also submit proof of social insurance payment for all academic staff who teach in the programme.
- 6. Furthermore, in order for the Agency to assure that the quality of the programmes of study is not compromised by any excess in the weekly **teaching load** of the academics, you need to submit the total number of teaching periods per week, for each academic/teacher and for each programme they are a part of, at City Unity College Nicosia. Additionally, their **CV's** should be updated so that their position at your College can be in view, under their current professional experience. In addition, from the requested "**Data**", all of the Teaching Staff's **Short CV's**



are missing (*Doc. 500.01.03/500.01.04, TABLE A: TEACHING STAFF*), and none of the programmes academics' profiles (name and rank) are uploaded on your **website**.

- 7. On page 23 TABLE D: WEEKLY TIMETABLE PER YEAR / PER SEMESTER (YEAR 3), and page 147 of your application, under Section 2: COURSE STRUCTURE AND ASSESSMENT, some of the Modules of the course for Year 3, are different, compared to the Year 3 Modules listed for the academic year 2023/24 on the London Metropolitan University webpage, according to the Course Structure Diagrams shown in ANNEX 1.
- 8. On page 43 Appendix 3 City Unity College (Nicosia) Ltd CYQAA Letter_030723 Section 'Certificate and transcript', it is stated that "graduates of the approved courses taught at the Partner Institution shall receive a certificate produced by the University and it will be the same certificate as London Metropolitan University students enrolled on the same course taught on its main campus". You need to submit a sample of the official document of the higher education qualification in a printout form.
- 9. On page 342 the documents for **Appendix 13** London Metropolitan University Lecturer CV's, were not included.

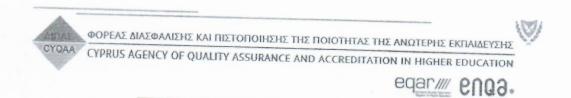

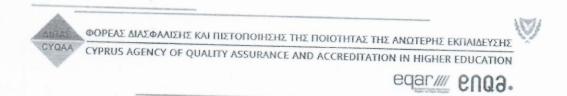

Buses: Just in front of the college, at 19, Stasinou Str. Engomi, Nicosia, students can use the bus network to any direction and destination in the city and province of Nicosia and Cyprus in general as well. Buses are not consistent in appearance, though the destination is usually displayed in the windscreen. Bus time tables and schedules are available from tourist offices or directly from the bus companies. Be aware that services stop early daily (at approximately 18:00) and there is limited bus service on weekends (some areas have no service on Sundays).

Bus fare is paid directly to the bus driver; exact change is required. Shared and private taxi services provide an alternative method of transport with the options being Island-wide



bus services, urban buses, rural buses, intercity taxis, urban taxis and rural taxis.

Student Code of Conduct

Purpose

The purpose of the Code of Student Conduct (the Code) is to define the responsibility of all City Unity College Nicosia students to act in a manner that respects the rights, safety and wellbeing of others. The intent of the Code is to provide a framework to resolve issues when civility and respect for the rights of others break down and informal resolution is not possible. These principles and values can only be realized in an atmosphere of respect, safety and security.

In the context of the Code, the goal and responsibility of City Unity College Nicosia is to provide an academic community encompassing all aspects of college life, such that the pursuit of education and personal growth can take place in a safe and welcoming environment. The Code includes coverage of incidents that occur on campus, which affect the City Unity College Nicosia workplace, living and study environment.

Scope

The Code applies to full-time and part-time (prospective or confirmed) student conduct from the time of application or registration in a program or course through to completion of the course or graduation from the program, where activities or actions are a component of the relationship between the student and the institution, or between community members.

Academic Advising

At City Unity College Nicosia academic advising is a shared process between the student and the academic advisor which enables students to explore and achieve educational, life and career goals.

To Achieve This Students Will:

- Value the role of the academic advising process as part of the college Experience
- Demonstrate the characteristics of a prepared advisee by bringing questions and material for discussion to advising sessions
- Develop an educational plan for successfully achieving their goals
- Use campus resources and services to assist them in achieving their academic, personal and career goals
- Follow through when referred to appropriate campus resources
- Be able to accurately read and effectively use a degree audit in their educational planning
- Complete educational goals in a timely manner based on the educational plan.



Academic Advisor Responsibilities

- Effectively communicate the curriculum and graduation requirements for the student's major per college academic policies and procedures.
- Assist students in the pre-registration process which may include checking for course pre-requisites and interpretation of college test scores.
- Encourage and guide students as they define and develop realistic goals.
- Encourage and support students as they make academic progress according to their educational plans.
- Provide students with information about strategies for using the available resources and services on campus.
- Assist students in understanding the purposes and goals of higher education and its effects on their lives and personal goals.
- Be accessible for advising students during posted office hours, or by telephone, email, or web access.
- Assist students in gaining decision-making skills and learning to assume responsibility for their educational plans and achievements.
- Maintain confidentiality.
- Assist students in working closely with their instructors and refer students to appropriate college sources when assistance is needed.

Advisee Responsibilities

- Schedule regular appointments and make regular contact with advisor during each semester.
- Keep all scheduled advising appointments
- Come prepared to each appointment with questions or materials for discussion.
- Be an active learner by participating fully in the advising experience.
- Ask questions if you do not understand an issue or have a specific concern.
- Enroll in the courses which you and your advisor have determined appropriate and follow-through with these courses.
- Keep a personal record of your progress toward meeting your goals. Use an audit sheet to track class completions.
- Organize official documents (transcripts, etc.) in an advising folder that will enable you to access them when needed.
- Complete all assignments or recommendations from your advisor.
- Clarify personal values and goals and provide your advisor with accurate information regarding your interests and abilities.
- Become knowledgeable about college programs, policies, and procedures.
- Accept responsibility for your decisions.



Orientation

Orientation, employment and career services and assistance with finding accommodation are just a few of the services offered to students at all stages of their College life by the Office of Student Affairs. Moreover, the Office of Student Affairs organizes and sponsors many extra-curricular programs and activities, which aim at enhancing students' life at City Unity College Nicosia. Student life is an important aspect of college education as it can offer a unique opportunity to develop leadership and communication skills. The Office of Student Affairs tries to cultivate a feeling of shared responsibility whereby students can learn the importance of teamwork and become members of an international community. Student Orientation Day

Orientation is an important service administered to all new students upon their arrival at the College. New students are required to attend a series of orientation seminars which, among other objectives, aim at:

- Making students aware of and experience all on and off-campus opportunities for personal, social, cultural and intellectual development.

During the orientation seminars, students are exposed to a variety of information relating to their studies and the College in general. They learn about the College structure and its operations and become acquainted with its officers and staff. Moreover, students are exposed to and thoroughly briefed on issues such as their rights and responsibilities and on matters such as academic regulations, assessment and grading. A very important part of the orientation for a student is getting to know the role of a student advisor. Student advisors help students prepare for their academic year, review the courses needed to fulfill graduation requirements and assist them in setting educational and career goals. Orientation concludes with a tour of all College facilities. Particular attention is given to the College library, where students are introduced to the variety of services it has to offer.

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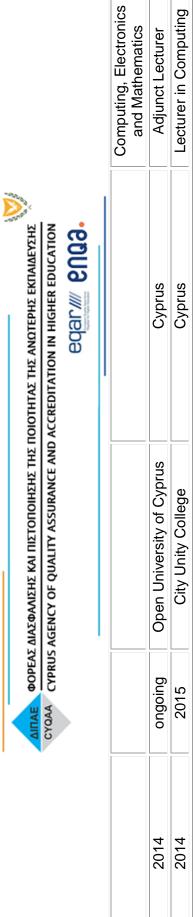
