VIEWS OF THE PHILIPS UNIVERSITY ON THE EXTERNAL EVALUATION REPORT SUBMITTED BY THE EXTERNAL EVALUATION COMMITTEE

Introduction

Philips University appreciates the constructive comments and suggestions given by the External Evaluation Committee (EEC) in their Evaluation Report dated 17 January, 2020. The University believes that the Evaluation Report leads to a positive decision for accreditation of Philips University at Institutional level.

As a matter of principle Philips University would like to emphasize the fact that the Evaluation concerns a new University that is not yet in operation, which by itself responds to certain remarks. However, the University adopts all the recommendations of the EEC which it has already fully implemented.

The university involves many areas concerning the organizational structure, regulations and procedures, which could be observed in the descriptions in the various documents provided, such as: the application for Institutional Evaluation, the Charter of the University and its Internal Inistitution's Internal Regulation, Rules and Policies. To provide an example of the discrepancy described above, the **Careers Office** of Philips University is fully organized and operational, however it will be observed in action only when the University has students and graduates, after the University operates for several years.

University's responses on observations and recommendations in the External Evaluation Report

Building Facilities – Students Welfare Services – Infrastructure

1.0 Building Facilities

1.1 Plans and Licences

 The Certificate for Adequate Electrical and Mechanical Installations, the missing certificate for the 46 existing parking spaces, as well as the additional certificate for a bus, were issued by certified professionals, members of the Technical Chamber of Cyprus (ETEK) and have already been delivered to CYQAA.

- The University building contractor has already started work concerning the entrance staircases and the small steps at the entrance in offices and lecture theatres in implementing of the EEC recommendations; (ref. 1.1.5.3).
- 3. New elevators as per the attached information, amounting to €52.000 started being constructed; (Appendix 1).

1.2 Other Facilities

We have arranged proper access for disabled persons from the car parking to the entrance of the elevator (ref. 1.2.8).

The University has made fully available teaching classrooms, lecture rooms, seminar rooms, laboratories and theatres as indicated below:

Classrooms:

There are 25 classes equipped with modern furniture, power-point, and electrical boards. Student capacity for these classrooms ranges from 30 to 50 students, 3 seminar rooms for 50 to 60 students, 1 conference room for 50 students and one theatre for 150 to 200 students; (ref 1.2.1. and 1.2.3).

Offices for teaching and administration staff:

There are 20 offices for teaching and administrative staff equipped with modern computers and furniture (ref. 1.2.2, 1.2.5).

1.6 As regards the parking spaces designed for students, all non-building plots on the campus, holding more than 150 parking places, have been made available for the use of students and University visitors in addition to the previous 46 parking places; (ref. 1.2.6).

It is very clear from the above that the university has secured a satisfactory structure for the projected number of students, faculty and administration. In addition, two additional buildings within the campus of 865m² and 3.960m² are under restoration;

2.0 Student Welfare Services

2.1 Parking Spaces for People with Disabilities

The University has already developed and applied parking spaces for people with disabilities. In addition, the university has applied to the Municipality of Strovolos and the Police Headquarters to obtain the approval of the authorities for the construction of special parking places in front of the entrance of the University for students with special needs. The University is compiling relevant rules and procedures for mitigating circumstances and special needs that are transparent and they will be published on the University website.

2.2 Recreation Areas

Philips University places great importance on the emotional, psychological and social maturity of students, arising from the strong belief that students should be provided with ample opportunities to develop such attributes.

All students are encouraged to participate actively in sports and related physical education activities. This approach rests on the belief that such activities help students become good team players. Social relationships are thus developed through play and interaction.

To help students fulfil the above objectives, the University encourages them to use the available sport facilities either to exercise on their own or to train in a more formal way as members of the University teams which participate in various national tournaments. Physical education activities are guided by qualified staff. On several occasions Philips sports teams have competed in Europe against other National champions.

In pursuit of implementing its philosophy the University encourages students to participate in a variety of social and other creative extra-curricular activities which aim to help students develop their overall personality. Such activities cover, amongst others, music, dancing, theatre and shows. All these activities culminate in a public show at the end of the Spring semester which is open to the community for viewing.

- The University provides an extensive space of 477m² for housing a modern cafeteria offering facilities for students to enjoy the consumption of beverages and snacks.
- The University offers amateurs and professionals two multi-purpose open courts and outstanding sports opportunities for playing and training football, basket-ball, volley-ball, hand-ball and tennis.
- A limited number of International Sports Scholarships may be available for outstanding athletes.

The Students' Union

The Students' Union to which all students automatically become members, is run by the students and operates for the benefit of the students. It exists to promote the social, cultural, academic and athletic life of the student body. The Union aims to represent the views of the students internally and externally of the University. Representatives of the Students' Union attend the University Council and Senate.

Clubs and Societies

A variety of opportunities are provided for students in their spare time and take the form of physical, social, cultural and other events. Clubs and Societies are formed according to the interests of the students, i.e, Dance, Music, Theatre, Photography, Fine Arts etc. The Clubs and Societies organise social events such as:

- Theatrical Performances.
- Photography Classes, Excursions and Exhibitions,
- Fine Arts Exhibitions.
- Concerts and Music Performances

Comments 2.7 and 2.9 as well as the general comments given are fully implemented through the University Charter and the Internal Inistitution's Internal Regulation, Rules and Policies. This implementation will be visible following the commencement of the operation of the University. Please see attached the relevant certificates concerning services linking the University with business; (Appendix 1):

- Hellenic Society for the Protection of Nature. and
- Epsilon Net Group of Companies, Greece,

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3.0 Infrastructure

As regards points 3.1, 3.2, 3.3, 3.4 above, concerning the computers available for students, the technological and technical support, the University has already extended the working hours of the Library and the computer labs. In addition, the University has placed an order for computers and interactive digital boards, most of which have already been delivered (**Appendix 2** consists of a copy of the invoices concerning new computers and interactive boards), amounting to €63,052.75.

The University has made arrangements for Eduroam and Eduroam to be available; (ref. 3.3) and the Classter Library System which has been adopted by the University has been integrated in an effective way (ref. 3.4).

1. Institution's Academic Profile and Orientation

We fully agree with the assessment of the academic profile and orientation of the institution.

Representatives from business, public sector and overseas universities participate in the University Council and other advisory bodies follows:

- Mr Nondas Metaxas, ex-Chief Executive Officer of the Cyprus Stock of Exchange;
- Mr Symeon Matsis, former Undersecretary of the Planning Bureau, and Ministry of Communication and Transport, of the Republic of Cyprus;
- Professor Emmanuel Petrakis, ex-Vice-Rector of the University of Crete;
- Professors from the universities: Aristotle of Salonica, National Kapodistrian University of Athens, Democritus University of Thrace, Klaipeda State University of Applied Sciences, Lithuania etc.
- Representatives from Epsilon Net Group of Companies, Greece.

Transfer of Students

Students from the Philips College will be transferred to the University following the admission and transfer policy of the University which appears in the Institutional Application under the title "transfer of students from other institutions". More precisely the procedure followed is similar to that applied by other private universities in Cyprus.

Areas for improvement and recommendations

All of the areas for improvement and for recommendations are fully implemented and will be in effect with the operation of the University.

2. Quality Assurance

2.2 Regarding the comments and suggestions on Quality Assurance, the University has developed and applied a detailed quality procedure which is included in the Internal Inistitution's Internal Regulation, Rules and Policies and explains fully how quality is ensured; (Appendix 3).

Concerning the policy on plagiarism, the University has developed an effective mechanism to avoid and handle cases of plagiarism which are explained in detail in the Inistitution's Internal Regulation, Rules and Policies (Appendix 4).

As regards students' participation in the Quality Assurance Committee it is determined by the existing guidelines of the CYQAA.

Final Examinations

Concerning the comment on final examination (70%) for assessment, it is clarified that 70% constitutes the total of both the mid-term (20%) and the final examination (50%), and 30% is for continuous assessment (attendance, participation and assignments).

3. Administration

The University appreciates the very positive assessment on the Administration.

4. Learning and Teaching

Concerning the involvement of Faculty members so that they engage more actively in the program structure and development, a specific Committee for the Development of a new program puts together the contributions of individual Faculty members in order to develop and complete the curriculum of the program. In addition, the Chair-person and the program Co-ordinator ensure continuous participation of Visiting Professors and other external experts.

Regarding the involvement of stakeholders, each School forms a Stakeholders' Advisory Board and actively seeks their advice for matters of Quality Assurance, development areas, new strategies evolving educational needs and new sets of

skills. In addition, the required by CYQAA Internal Quality Assurance Committee of Department is actively involved in the development of new program of study.

Admission Criteria

The Admission criteria are described in detail in the Internal Inistitution's Internal Regulation, Rules and Policies. In brief, admission to undergraduate courses requires:

 Graduation from an approved course in an accredited secondary education school of 12 years of education and, in addition, evidence that the applicant is competent in written and spoken English, and successful completion of a personal interview with our Admission Officers, either in person or by phone/skype OR holders of three GCE at Advanced level and O.L. in English Language.

The above admission requirements for undergraduate courses are in line with the law of private universities. In addition, the University Authorities have already enriched the existing admission requirements with the placement test as follows.

Placement Test

All new students are required to take standardized placement tests. Placement tests aim to assess each student's potential and measure quantitative and verbal aptitudes. Placement tests are administered during orientation week. All tests are then screened by a panel. Appropriate programs are then drawn up to assist students in light of the observations made by the panel.

5. Teaching Staff

The recruitment of faculty is still in progress, based on already announce in both Press and the University's website regarding job vacancies. The University has decided to recruit permanent junior faculty and early career researchers, thereby increasing the percentage of Faculty employed exclusively by the University.

The University has already made the necessary arrangements for mentoring new Faculty members.

6. Research

The University has developed a comprehensive research policy which appears in the Internal Inistitution's Internal Regulation, Rules and Policies; (Appendix 5).

According to its Research Policy, the University values and supports research activity by faculty members as reflected by specific incentives such as teaching reduction load, covering expenses for visiting conferences and publishing. In addition, we support junior members for career profession and promotion and administrative staff. Special care is taken to enhance a supportive environment and culture through funding and management.

The University has already made arrangements to acquire databases for Accounting and Business Research (Compustat, Amadeous and Bloomberg, etc.).

The University has already appointed a Research Management Committee which comprises of visiting and permanent full-time faculty members, who have a long record of international publications and research activity. This Research Management Committee implements the Research Policy. Junior faculty members, business entrepreneurs and stakeholders from Cyprus and Greece are engaged in this process. The Research Center is headed by Professor John S. Kaminarides, an internationally established Researcher.

Conclusions and Final Remarks

Philips University appreciates the constructive comments and recommendations of the ECC. As for the suggestions for improvements, the University has already fully implemented all of them.

Philips University is gratified by the statement of the EEC that:

"The applicant institution shows a lot to commend. These include the commitment and perseverance of the founder-president, the business model innovation that is based on quality staff from other institutions, its intention to combine quality teaching with research, the location and facilities".

Philips University's responses on the observations of the EEC are the following:

- The University has already introduced differentiated courses on Philips programs of study which are closely aligned to national and market needs such as: Health Services Management, Economics of Health Services, Strategic Management of Tourism, Hospitality Events. In addition, general education courses related to Cyprus and Europe have been incorporated in the first and second years of study.
- Recruitment of faculty is still in progress, and the university has handled issues pertaining to hiring, training and mentoring junior faculty members for academic entry, and for development of a research portfolio in their subject specializations.
- 3. The Program Coordinators for all the programs of study belong to the permanent Faculty.
- 4. The University has developed clear recruitment and promotion policies which can be found in the Internal Inistitution's Internal Regulation, Rules and Policies of the University. A special Committee which comprises permanent and visiting Faculty has been formed for the improvement of the recruitment and promotion policies.
- 5. Those students from Philips College who wish to be transferred to the University will be transferred following the admission and transfer policy of the University, which appears in the Institutional Application, under the title transfer of students from other institution. More precisely, the procedure followed is similar to that applied by other private universities in Cyprus.
- 6. Two more buildings of 3.960m² and 865m² situated in the same campus of the university are available for future needs of the University. The Council of the University has already approved the budget for the purchase of databases such as: Datastream, Compust, Amadeous, Boomberg etc. In addition, to the purchase of databases, Journal access has been extended to all the workstations in staff offices.
- Philips University undertakes periodic reviews of market needs and related prospective demands. The University offers specialized short courses for individual organizations and consulting services.

Philips University has an established alumni network. The alumni members attest to the high reputation of the University, and are actively supportive and engaged with all University's activities.

- 8. The University has developed a comprehensive Research Policy. A Research Management Committee which comprises of visiting and permanent and visiting Faculty members, who have extensive research activity and publications in international journals have been formed to improve the implementation of a clear and transparent Research Policy.
- A Special Committee has been appointed with the aim of bringing into the decision making processes more local stakeholders and business partners.
- 10. As it has already been mentioned above, buildings which were erected within plots 857 and 858, situated in the same campus of the University are available for further building expansion.
- The University has already developed processes concerning the engagement of visiting Faculty members in the continuous review of its programs.

Conclusion

Taking into consideration the positive Report of the EEC and the full implementation of their recommendations, including those concerning the Business Studies program, the University is in a position to begin its operation in February 2020, beginning of the Spring Semester.

X. QUALITY ASSURANCE POLICY

1.0 INTRODUCTION

The vision of Philips University is to be a leading University in the region, by creating and offering Excellence in Teaching, Research and Service with a strong student focus. The predefined mission of (a) educating our students, for successful careers and life achievement, (b) understanding and underpinning the needs and evolutions of our society, (c) creating knowledge and progress, through research and innovation, generate the University's commitment to continuous improvement of Quality Assurance, in which Accountability, Responsibility, Consistency, Transparency and Innovation are *sine qua non*.

The system is built around established central values: Commitment to Excellence, Student Centered, People Oriented, Innovative, Accountable, and Socially Responsible. It is focused on the student, and it is balanced along the main axes of Teaching, Research and Service. The student focus is reflected in the quality management system. The University not only believes that it is better to involve students as active partners, but also endeavors to underline that quality management, by involving customers and key persons, is an essential element of public or private, and business or social-profit organizations. The University aims to sensitize students and staff to this practice of accountability and social responsibility.

Philips University draws upon the potential of motivated people in a motivating workplace. Management, therefore, is also focused on rewarding positive new practices and sharing them rather than overly controlling and disseminating existing practices. The quality assurance targets innovation and flexibility, and wants to avoid rigidity. Staff at the University are intrinsically motivated by customer focus and social responsibility. The fact that they elect to work in a university with a dynamic profile and a focus on performance reward, is an important element in human resources management (HRM). Innovation and flexibility are reflected in the Quality Management System (QMS), and the system itself is

subject to regular reviews of efficiency and user-friendliness by the Internal Quality Committee.

Philips University meets the requirements and the scope of the European Standards and Guidelines on Quality Assurance (ESG) utilizing a method of sustainable and Integrated Quality Management (IQM). It focuses both on institutional quality assurance and program quality management.

Programs are described according to the European Credit Transfer System (ECTS). Course descriptions contain the learning outcomes, competence goals, content and study materials, study volume, teaching hours and teaching methods, and methods for assessment. The course is set according to the European Qualification Framework (EQF) guidelines and national requirements.

Policy data, guidelines and decisions regarding quality management are communicated throughout the organization. Staff and student representatives are involved in outlining the quality management policy.

2.0 INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE COMMITTEE

The Internal Quality Committee has the following composition:

- (a) The Vice-Rector for Academic Affairs, who shall preside;
- (b) one (1) member of the academic staff of each School, having significant scientific work and extensive academic experience covering preferably and, where possible, expertise in quality assurance procedures,
- (c) up to two (2) University members specializing in issues of quality assurance,
- (d) one (1) student representative who is nominated by the body representing the students.

3.0 THE SYSTEM OF INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE

3.1 Internal Quality Assurance at Philips University is conducted in accordance with the European Standards and Guidelines (ESG) and the relevant national legislation.

The Internal Quality Assurance Committee has the overall control and supervision of the University's quality assurance system, whereas the central Quality Manager/Coordinator supervise(s) the quality management processes of teaching and learning, research, service-provision, and administration, without being responsible for the results of these key domains. The quality manager is responsible for:

- (a) The coordination and updating of QM procedures and action plans as a central section in the QM handbook.
- (b) The monitoring of the efficiency and use of the central mechanisms and indicators of quality assurance, on institutional level and on program level.
- (c) The supervision of QM reporting for internal and external quality assurance, in cooperation with the academic and the administrative units responsible for providing information.
- (d) Preparing and presiding the decision-making process in the Internal Quality Assurance Committee, and reporting to the top managerial group for final decisionmaking.
- (e) The coaching of staff working in the QM unit and the supervision of key performance factors that are specific for QM.
- (f) The communication about QM issues and the provision of QM information within Philips University.
- (g) The training of QM competences in personnel with a special focus on managerial functions and QSG-members, the development of QM methods and the deployment of mechanisms specific to QM.

3.2 Quality Assurance Procedure for Academic Departments:

The QA Coordinator submits the SAR (Self- Assessment Report) template to Program Coordinators, via The Departmental Internal Quality Assurance Committee. A selection of a minimum of five faculty members is created by the Program Coordinators, in order to participate in a quantitative research for the quality of a Program.

A qualitative research is conducted by interviewing ten students. The interviews are held by the Program Coordinator. The completed questionnaires are submitted to the Rector's office for any other reference.

For the production of the SAR (Self- Assessment Report), cooperation is necessary among the different departments of the University, such as the Erasmus Office, the Office of Student Affairs, the Research Centre, the Department of Enrollment, the MIS Department, the Administrators and the QA Coordinator. The QA Coordinator and the School Administrators are responsible for submission of a SAR template complete with the following data to the Programs Coordinators:

- (i) Student and Faculty Mobility
- (ii) Student Employability
- (iii) Research Projects related to the Program
- (iv) Assessment Scores
- (v) Study progress
- (vi) Student Demographics
- (vii) Students' Progress
- (viii) F2015 Instructor Evaluation Results
- (ix) Curriculum
- (x) Semester Breakdown
- (xi) Syllabi
- (xii) Faculty info
- (xiii) Faculty CVs

Each Program coordinator is responsible, to develop the SAR and then the Departmental Internal Quality Assurance Committee finalizes it and proposes actions for improvement. The completed SAR is submitted to the Chair of the Department and the Dean of School.

Formulation of action plans concerning the suggestions for further actions made in the SARs, were decided. For this purpose, *Quality Improvement Plan for the Program form* is used in setting priorities for Improvement Plans.

The SAR and the *Quality Improvement Plan for the Program form* obtain approval form the Departmental and School Councils and both are submitted to the Internal Quality Assurance Committee.

Following a brief presentation of the SAR conclusions with emphasis on the Quality Improvement Plan of the Program form by the Program Coordinators involved, a meeting of the Internal Quality Committee is scheduled. The meeting is intended, for discussion and endorsement of the Self-Assessment Reports of the reviewed programs.

The Internal Quality Assurance Committee supervises the strategic quality management of the University, i.e. the choice of models and mechanisms in Quality Management, the key performance factors and indicators (KPF/KPI), the definition and the performance of working groups.

Finally, the Program Coordinators deliver a *Mid-term* (every 6 months) and a *Final Implementation Report - Quality Improvement Plan of the Program form* to the Internal Quality Assurance Committee, in order to validate the procedure.

3.2 Quality Assurance Procedure for Administration Departments:

The Policy of Quality Assurance is the main pillar of a coherent institutional Quality Assurance system that forms a cycle for continuous improvement and contributes to the accountability of the institution. The Quality Assurance Policy of Philips University and the Mission statement are crucial documents that are visible to all people involved in the University. The review of how Philips University scores on the strategic elements in this mission, based on quality indicators, is a quality management document.

21.0 POLICY ON PREVENTING AND DEALING WITH ACADEMIC WRITING MISCONDUCT

21.0 Definitions and abbreviations

- 21.1 Academic integrity means honesty and responsibility in scholarship and research. It involves creating and expressing one's own ideas in coursework and published works, acknowledging all sources of information. It also implies completing assignments independently, or acknowledging collaboration (when it is required). Furthermore, it requires honesty during examinations and the accurate reporting of results when conducting research.
- 21.2 Academic writing misconduct is any action or attempted action that may result in an unfair academic advantage for oneself, or an unfair academic advantage or disadvantage for any other member(s) of the academic community. Academic writing misconduct includes, but is not limited to, unacknowledged appropriation of the work of others; altering academic documents or transcripts; falsification or fabrication of data; misrepresentation of data to gain access to materials before they are intended to be available; failure to declare conflicts of interest; failure to follow accepted procedures or meet legal or ethical requirements, or to exercise due care in carrying out responsibilities for avoiding unreasonable harm or risk to humans, animals and/or the environment; and helping anyone to gain an unfair academic advantage.
- 21.3 Plagiarism is the use of words, inventions, ideas, opinions, discoveries, artwork images, music recordings, or computer-generated work (from any printed, digital or internet-based source, whether published or not) of another person, even if the content is openly licensed, and presenting it as one's own work without acknowledging the source. Plagiarism may be the result of intentional, inattentive or unintentional behavior.

Plagiarism cannot be confirmed by mere similarities between words in the source text and the borrowed text, as in the case of terminology, commonly used phrases and known facts. Plagiarism should be distinguished from other forms of academic writing misconduct, such as, but not limited to:

- collusion and fabrication or falsification of data;
- purchasing of assignments, dissertations, and theses via the Internet, or using a ghost writer and presenting this person's documents as one's own work;
- presenting the same work for more than one course or in consecutive years; and
- the re-use of one's previously evaluated or published material without acknowledgment or any kind of indication.
- 21.4 Acknowledgment is the use of references in academic writing to indicate the source of previously expressed ideas or published material and the details of the publication.

- 21.5 Good Academic Writing refers clearly and consistently to the sources used; bears evidence of individual and independent thinking on and processing of existing knowledge; and includes citations and paraphrases that are correct and just versions of the contents of the source text.
- 21.6 First Written Warnings are warnings for very minor offences, when it is seldom necessary to embark on additional disciplinary procedures.
- 21.7 Final Written Warnings are documents that immediately follow on a First Written Warning when firmer action is demanded due to the First Written Warning being disregarded, or because the offence was repeated, additional offences occurred and/or the offence (first or recurring offence) is considered serious enough to deserve disciplinary action firmer than a First Written Warning.

22.0 Background

Academic integrity is the moral code of academia and the foundation of academic excellence. It requires honest as well as responsible scholarship and is an expression of personal integrity and honesty. Upholding the practice of academic integrity is, therefore, a reflection of individual, personal and professional integrity.

This Policy on Preventing and Dealing with Academic Writing Misconduct contributes to instilling the values of academic integrity, scientific discourse, high standards, and ethics in all academic endeavours. Academic writing misconduct and plagiarism are serious concerns and are subject to strict corrective action.

23.0 What happens if a student plagiarises?

Where plagiarism is identified, it will be necessary to decide:

- · Whether the plagiarism should be dealt with at an informal or a formal level; and
- If a formal response is required, the level of response which is appropriate

This decision requires a determination as to whether the alleged plagiarism in significant or not.

When a teacher suspects an instance of plagiarism, the following steps will be taken:

The teacher who is marking the paper or assessing the creative project will initially assess the degree of plagiarism, taking into account how much material was plagiarised, how much it impacted on the work presented as original, and the percentage load of the particular assessment task within the course.

The teacher will inform the Head of Department, who will assist in determining whether there is plagiarism and, if so, whether it is non-significant plagiarism or significant plagiarism.

In determining whether plagiarism is non-significant or significant, and assessing its seriousness, consideration is given to the student's apparent level of intention to deceive. The level and effect of that intention will be the primary consideration in determining penalties or further action.

If the plagiarism in the assignment or project is judged as non-significant the Head of Department and the teacher concerned will discuss this with the student, will listen to the student's viewpoint and, if appropriate, issue a verbal warning to the student. The matter will also be noted on the student's file and a copy of the note will be provided to the student.

If the plagiarism in the assignment or project is judged as significant, the Head of Department and the teacher concerned will discuss this with the student. The student will be given advance notice of the purpose of the meeting and may bring a support person to the interview. The purpose of the interview will be to determine whether and how much plagiarism has occurred and gives the student the opportunity to respond. If requested, the student will be given the opportunity to respond in writing before any decision is taken regarding penalties.

During the interview, should the student's work be confirmed as containing plagiarism, the range of likely penalties will be discussed. Depending on the level of significance of the plagiarism:

- the student may be required to undertake an additional assessment task in that subject, or to re-submit the original assessment task after re-working it
- the student's work may be assessed as Fail (F) for the subject for the relevant time period
- the student may receive a grade of Fail (F) as their final assessment for the subject for the year, which could lead to failure of the course
- the most serious cases of significant offences could be considered as serious misconduct and, after investigation, penalties could include failure in the course and exclusion from Philips University.

In all these cases, the matter will be noted on the student's file and a copy of the note will be provided to the student.

If a student disagrees with the penalty issued as a result of an allegation of plagiarism, the student may submit a grievance to the Disciplinary Committee for examination.

XI. THE UNIVERSITY'S RESEARCH POLICY, REGULATIONS & PROCEDURES

1.0 INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 The Research Policy of Philips University provides a code of conduct for research and is intended for all faculty members, special teaching personnel, scientific collaborators, research associates, and students carrying out research at or on behalf of the University. The university focuses on both fundamental and applied research and wherever possible the commercial application or exploitation of the research results.
- 1.2 As stated in the mission, Philips University aspires to excellence of quality in all aspects of its work. Research and scholarship is central to the mission of the University. It is the cornerstone of the continuing creation of the knowledge, which is the foundation of all disciplines.
- 1.3 Research and scholarship can flourish only in an environment of academic freedom, which includes freedom of inquiry and the right to disseminate the results, thereof, freedom to challenge conventional thought, freedom from institutional censorship, and the privilege of conducting research on human and animal subjects.
- 1.4 There is a Research Center, the mission of which is to create and maintain an atmosphere conducive to the pursuit of research by supporting, promoting and enhancing research actions and collaborations both within and outside the University.

2.0 THE SCOPE OF RESEARCH POLICY

2.1 All academic activity at Philips University should be conducted according to good ethical practice and with the highest standards of integrity. This policy, however, sets out the principles and procedures for research. Ethical issues arising from learning and teaching should be addressed by the program or module leader seeking advice as appropriate from the Vice-Rector for Research and Innovation of the University.

2.2 The term research refers to:

- a. original investigation leading to the creation of knowledge
- replication of an investigation for the purposes of developing the researcher this
 will include undergraduate independent studies and postgraduate dissertations,
 but also smaller scale projects that form part of a module's assessment.
- c. evaluation
- d. audit

2.3 The term researcher, refers to:

- a. any member of staff at Philips University
- b. any student at Philips University engaging in research
- c. any individual who is not a member of staff or student at the University, undertaking research using University premises and facilities, and/or on behalf of the University (hereafter referred to as an Associate Researcher).
- d. researchers should be able to demonstrate that the research they undertake is worthwhile and necessary.

3.0 ETHICAL PRINCIPLES

The University's stance on ethical issues in underpinned by the following key principles:

3.1 Research must be:

- justified
- · informed consent must be given by participants
- · participation in research must be voluntary
- confidentiality must be ensured
- any risk of harm to participants, animal subjects or the researcher(s) should be appropriately mitigated.
- 3.2 All research undertaken under the auspices of Philips University must meet statutory requirements. Of particular relevance is the Bioethics Law (N.150 (I)/2001 and 53 (I)/2010), the Data Protection Law (2001), the Patients Protection Law (2005), and

- all those laws that create the legal framework for the Cyprus National Bioethics Committee.
- 3.3 Researchers in particular disciplines should comply with any research ethics guidelines set out by their professional associations.
- 3.4Research Councils, charitable trusts and other research funding bodies in most cases require an undertaking from grant applicants that research proposals involving human participants have been approved by the University Research Ethics Committee or another appropriate body. Some also require audited compliance with their guidelines.

4.0 FUNDAMENTAL PRINCIPLES OF THE RESEARCH POLICY

- 4.1 The University wishes to remain as a Center of excellence and to keep upgrading its research capabilities. In this regard, the Vice-Rector for Research and Innovation of the University is vested with the responsibility of facilitating the research effort of the University. However, each department will be responsible for its own research in the same way that each academic will be responsible for his own research.
- 4.2 All academics carry the responsibility of enhancing the research capabilities of the University.
- 4.3 The research activities of each department should respect the research standards of the University as communicated from time to time.
- 4.4 The University will support the research capabilities and research potential of staff and students.
- 4.5 The University research policy will be reviewed periodically with a view to bringing it in line with accepted research practices as other learned academic institutions.
- 4.6 Research work should be reviewed methodically before being published so as to ensure consistency with the standards set by the University.

- 4.7 The University encourages academics to be in constant touch with new developments in the research field and to evaluate the relevance of such developments to activities of Philips University.
- 4.8 The University will provide staff with advice on research.
- 4.9 Departments and academics are expected to work in unison with each other to further the research activities of the University.
- 4.10 Academics are expected to work closely with outside research bodies that impact on the University and its research activities and to ensure that the University benefits for such contacts.
- 4.11 Staff are encouraged to exchange information with respected research bodies and to make sure that ideas flow without hindrance in all directions and that such exchanges are meaningful to the University its staff and students.
- **4.12** The University expects academics to set up research timetables and deadlines and adhere to them.
- 4.13 Academics are encouraged to find self-financing research projects.
- **4.14** Academics are encouraged to attend presentations, seminars and other learning activities covering research methodology and related issues.
- 4.15 Staff are encouraged to attend academic conferences and to read papers.

5.0 BASIC OBLIGATIONS

- 5.1 The primary responsibility for the selection and carrying out of Research shall rest with the Researcher and to this end he or she shall:
 - maintain the highest standards of honesty, integrity and ethical behavior in all Research;

- familiarize himself or herself with and adhere to the Regulatory Framework and the regulations, policies and guidelines of any Agency relevant to his or her Research;
- (iii) not misrepresent his or her academic, professional or employment credentials or experience;
- (iv) obtain necessary approvals including, but not limited to, ethics, protocol and standard operating procedure approvals, before engaging in a Research activity for which prior approval is necessary; and (v) use scholarly and scientific rigor and integrity in obtaining, recording and analyzing Data, and in reporting and publishing results.
- 5.1 The University shall take reasonable measures to ensure that researchers are made aware of, and kept informed of changes to the Regulatory Framework relevant to Research.
- 5.2 In the case of collaborative or team research, the Principal Investigator shall take reasonable measures to ensure that the members of the Research group or team are aware of and comply with the Regulatory Framework relevant to the research being undertaken.
- 5.3 The Office of the Dean of each School shall implement reasonable measures to ensure that students who engage in research are aware of: (i) their obligations in respect to academic integrity and the ethical conduct of research; (ii) the Regulatory Framework relevant to their research.

5.3.4 A supervisor of Students engaged in Research shall take reasonable measures to:

- ensure that the students have been advised of their obligations in respect of academic integrity and the ethical conduct of Research;
- ensure that the students have received a copy of the Regulatory Framework relevant to their particular research;

- (c) provide the students with a copy of any research related documents which the Students have been asked to sign; and
- (d) disclose to the students any special conditions concerning such matters as constraints on publication, limitations on future use of data, and ownership of intellectual property that may influence a student's decision to participate in the research.
