Overall, the Committee is satisfied with the organisation of teaching work, the design and delivery of teaching and the teaching personnel in the programme. However, the Committee offers some comments and recommendations for the College's consideration in the relevant sections 1.1-1.3 of the Document Number: 300.1,

Overall, the Committee is satisfied with the purpose and objectives and learning outcomes of the programme, the quality assurance mechanisms and processes in place, as well as the management, international dimensions and employability of the programme as a whole. However, the Committee offers a number of comments and suggestions regarding the structure and content of the programme in Section 2.2 of the Document Number: 300.1. Some additional comments on the other criteria of assessment for the programme can be found across Section 2.1-2.6.

3. RESEARCH WORK AND SYNERGIES WITH TEACHING

- Research Teaching Synergies

Overall, the Committee provides a positive assessment of the research-teaching synergies based on a definition of 'research' in the context of vocational learning, training and pedagogy. Also, the Committee welcomes the Research Centre initiative of the College and is pleased to see the existence of internal funds in support of this initiative.

The Committee finds satisfactory the infrastructure and facilities available to the students in the programme. Also, the administrative and student welfare support mechanisms and processes in place seem to be sufficiently effective. However, the Committee provides in Section 4.2 of the Document Number: 300.1 some recommendations on enhancing the accessibility of suitable teaching materials and other learning resources for the programme.

Regarding admissions:

- 1. For i when it is stated: 'άλλο ισοδύναμο προσόν', we would advise some examples of equivalent qualifications that the College accepts for this programme.
- 2. It needs to be clear that there is no grading scale or minimum required grades for those applicants who have completed 12 year-long education (including completion of 6 year-long secondary education).
- 3. We would like to inform the College that the use of GCS 'O' terminology, which is compatible with the Cypriot regulation, is currently out of date in the UK, as it was changed into GCSE as of the early 1990s.

Regarding disclosure of curricula, it did not become fully clear to the Committee what are the procedures and times and to what extent curricula are disclosed to students and through what means.

Regarding the procedures for the fulfillment of assignments, the Committee recommends that students are informed of teaching term deadlines for their assignments at the outset of each semester.

Regarding the procedures for the conduct and format of the examinations, the Committee recommends that course leaders are accessible to answer student questions/queries at the start of an exam.

Regarding control mechanisms for student performance, the Committee assesses such mechanisms as quite satisfactory overall. However, regarding the

work placement (practicum) of 1 month long, the Committee recommends putting in place statutory mechanisms and clear guidelines on supervision, support and assessment of students throughout and by the end of their work placement.

Regarding the methodology utilized in each course, the Committee is overall satisfied with the methodology in place. However, the Committee has observed some inconsistencies between how a module/course is presented (theoretical or

practical) and the description of teaching/learning methods utilized. Specifically, the Committee has identified this inconsistency in the following 4 modules/courses;

- JOUR212 Αστυνομικό και Δικαστηριακό Ρεπορτάζ not clear whether the sessions titled 'Παρακολούθηση και κάλυψη δίκης' are practical. If so, this needs to be clarified, as this, alongside with the sessions involving visits to key sites of reporting could provide a mixed theoretical and practical character to this course.
- JOUR213 Σύνταξη Ραδιοφωνικού Λόγου. This is presented as theoretical, but under 'teaching methods' one reads that students participate in 'ομαδικές ή προσωπικές πρακτικές ασκήσεις σε στούντιο', so here it appears there is a practical dimension in this course, which needs to be clarified and presented properly.
- JOUR217 Τεχνικές Συνέντευξης II. This is presented as theoretical, but under 'teaching methods' one reads that students participate in 'προσωπικές και ομαδικές συνεντεύξεις με καθοδήγηση από τον διδάσκοντα', so here it appears there is a practical element in this course, which needs to be clarified and presented properly.
- JOUR309 Σύνταξη Τηλεοπτικού Λόγου. This is presented as theoretical, but under 'syllabus' and 'teaching methods' one reads that students engage extensively in practical training so here it appears there is a practical dimension in this course, which needs to be clarified and presented properly.

Regarding teaching materials, although the Committee is aware of the systemic / external conditions that often prevent the latest bibliography from being utilised, it would like to recommend frequent updating of teaching materials and minimum inclusion of recent academic work including journal articles in the field.

The Committee considers the **overall number of full time teaching staff** to be adequate. However, **regarding the areas of expertise**, the Committee would like to recommend that the personnel should be enhanced with expertise in the area of public relations, while equipping the programme with members with additional postgraduate qualifications in the field of media and communication would further empower the quality of the content and delivery of the programme.

Regarding publications in the subject areas of journalism and PR, although we rated this with 3*, we consider this as not necessary due to the vocational nature of the programme.

Overall, the Committee is happy with how the course curricula define the expected learning outcomes, the content, the teaching and learning approaches and the method of assessing student performance. However, the Committee strongly recommends that the learning outcomes, content, teaching materials, length of final project etc are defined more clearly and in more detail for the following 3 modules:

- 1. Final project I & II (Τελική Εργασία I & II).
- 2. Useful concepts in journalism (Χρήσιμες Έννοιες για Δημοσιογράφους)
- 3. New digital technological environment for advertising (Νέο ψηφιακό τεχνολογικό περιβάλλον και διαφήμιση)

The Committee thinks that **the program of study is structured** not in an obviously consistent manner and in sequence and it is not fully clear to the Committee how students progress their learning through the 3 years of study from simple concepts and practices to more complex and cognitively advanced ones.

For instance, a specialized course such as Crisis Management (currently in Semester 2) should be taught much later in the programme. Another example is that of Photojournalism taught in Semester 2, which is specialized and more suitable for the second or third year of the programme. These are indicative examples and we would invite the programme team to revisit the structure of the programme as a whole in a reflective and constructive way.

The Committee thinks that the higher education qualification awarded, the learning outcomes and the content of the program are consistent for the Journalism component of the programme, but would like to recommend increase of the total number of ECTS (i.e., weighting) of the PR component of the programme. Alternatively, if the College wishes not to alter the weighting of the PR component, the Committee would recommend that the programme team considers the possibility of modifying the title of the programme to 'Journalism With Public Relations'.

Regarding general education as part of the programme, the Committee would like to invite the College to consider the addition of social science courses/modules to the programme, such as that of Social Psychology.

Regarding the **number of the programme's courses**, we consider this being disproportionally large. Regarding the **content of the programme's courses**, the Committee would like to recommend:

- The inclusion of a course on social science research methods as students might wish to use scientific research methods that are different to the journalistic methods they are currently taught.
- 2. The consideration of possible modifications to the weighting of the PR courses as stated above.

Note the expected number of students who will be studying simultaneously at another academic institution, based on your experience so far, regarding students who study simultaneously in the programs of your institution.
