The evaluation committee consisted of 3 academics and a student representative who visited the premises of the City Unity College. After a briefing by the head of the Unit, the committee received a detailed presentation on the proposed program. In turn a number of meetings were held with teaching staff, administrative staff and students. In addition, the evaluation committee had the opportunity to tour the facilities and see first-hand the learning environment and service provided. Finally, the committee had an extensive discussion with members of staff in order to clarify any points that needed further clarification.

The committee would like to thank colleagues at City Unity College for providing all the requested documentation and evidence for the purpose of conducting this evaluation.

### **FINDINGS:**

### 1. EFFECTIVENESS OF TEACHING WORK – AVAILABLE RESOURCES

The evaluation committee has reviewed the structure and content of the proposed BA in Business Administration. The committee has found the program to be well-aligned with the expected standards of business administration courses.

More specifically, the program features a number of modules that are organised across four pathways. The module outlines offered detailed information about the content of each module, learning outcomes, its assessment, core text material etc. These are appropriate for the intended level and provide a good mixture of business and specialised knowledge.

Varied assessment methods ensure that the learning outcomes will be measured and achieved appropriately. This applies to both hard and soft skills and competences. The assessments feature both formative and summative methods.

The committee was pleased to see first-hand the enthusiastic attitude of the teaching and supporting personnel. The teaching team is equipped with the adequate credentials and possesses practical experience for the successful delivery of the proposed program. Existing evidence support the notion that the teaching team is likely to be effective in delivering quality education for this program.

City Unity College offers a good platform on which this program can be effectively delivered. The available resources should meet the current and near-term demands. Plans are in place to further expand and extend the infrastructure that will make it possible to recruit larger cohort. The infrastructure includes both teaching and learning facilities and attractive common areas for socialising.

The program learning objectives and outcomes are in line with the City Unity College mission. More specifically, the College aspires to develop managers that are competent, open-minded, responsible and enterprising. To this end the program comprises of numerous modules that have individual aims and objectives that collectively correspond to the overall program ones.

The structure of the programs features four pathways (namely business administration, digital marketing, business innovation and retail management) that are linked to current trends and developments in the field of business.

The overall organization of the program offers sufficient flexibility for the three student intakes. There are clear pre-requisites when modules build on previous to progress in a specific knowledge area.

The outline of each module defines outcomes, assessment methods, learning resources etc. that were reviewed and deemed appropriate. The curriculum is developed in a manner that allows natural progression throughout the academic stages (4 years of study).

Modules are evaluated by students at the end of each semester. The feedback received is assessed by the teaching team and program coordinator. When necessary, appropriate actions can be taken to ensure that feedback has been appropriate fed into the program evaluation and restructuring.

The curriculum comprises of numerous modules that offer an international flavor to students and prepare them for working in a globalized business environment. The teaching team can potentially share their own industry experiences and blend them into teaching. Alongside the adjunct teaching staff that bring a current industry expertise, there are also visiting academics from foreign institutions that provide further opportunities for internationalization. City Unity College makes effort to get involved in mobility schemes such as the Erasmus one.

The proposed program's management team has sufficient expertise and experience to manage and effectively to deliver such a program.

### 3. RESEARCH WORK AND SYNERGIES WITH TEACHING

### Research Teaching Synergies

The majority of staff members of the teaching team hold PhDs in their respective arears. Staff members are encouraged by senior management to upgrade their academic credentials where such opportunities appear.

Although the roles undertaken do not call for explicit research activities, a number of staff members are involved in publishing in academic journals and externally-funded projects. City Unity College is supportive of such activities and offers opportunities and tangible incentives for further research development. Staff appeared to be aware of them and making good use when possible.

The external evaluation committee identified that the learning staff acknowledges the importance and value of research led teaching. To this end staff often uses accredited academic resources to support the learning process.

### 4. ADMINISTRATION SERVICES, STUDENT WELFARE AND SUPPORT OF TEACHING WORK

The staff and student handbooks provided a clear outline of the administrative processes and mechanisms that are in place. These underpin the administrative functions and how associated administrative services are operationalised. Administrative services included among others student well-fare, career development, counselling and general advising.

The evaluation committee inspected the library and found it to be well-organised. More resources were due to be added soon. A challenge identified was that student did not make the full use of the library facilities, despite the encouragement by the College.

The information communication and technology (ICT) services provided internet access throughout the building. A number of computer labs were well-equipped with up-to-date software and hardware.

Academic registrar and financial services are available to maintain student records and provide support to the smooth operation of the College. The financial planning based on the number of students expected appears to be reasonable. If the plans materialise, the new income stream generated will make it possible to further invest and expand the services provided of the City Unity College. The evaluation committee was informed of future plans for expanding the available spaces, which will make it possible to host new services and larger cohorts.

Clear admissions criteria and requirements have been established. The College expects a healthy number of student to enroll to the proposed program. The number of students in each class will adhere to the regulations set by the Ministry. The staff-student ratio is satisfactory and can effectively stimulate learning and monitor student performance. The current resources available should be sufficient to support near-term cohorts. The College has plans for further expansion in order to be able to cater for higher demands. The College has processes (e.g. Turnitin) in place to ensure that students meet academic conduct expectations as outlined in their handbooks. In case of academic disputes there is an internal complaints procedure that can be followed.

The committee feels that the teaching methods for the proposed program are in line with current pedagogical practices. The methodology of each course is suitable for adults. The infrastructure (rooms, A/V facilities, library, online platforms etc.) are sufficiently supporting of the program. A number of different assessment methods are utilized across the board and these are clearly communicated to the students. Each assessment is internally moderated for quality assurance purposes. In addition, a mixture of formative and summative methods are used for providing feedback to students. It will be useful for City Unity College teaching staff to consider how these come together more holistically.

The proposed program has a clear structure that consists of a number of modules in the area of Business Administration. The program features 4 pathways namely, digital marketing, business innovation, business administration and retail management. These are areas of potential growth that market research suggests to be sought after. The pathways include specialized modules that are typically offered in the 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> year. The program concludes with a research dissertation on a self-selected topic. Assessment practice on a module level is along the expected pedagogical lines. It may be useful if assessment strategy was considered more broadly on a program level too. The proposed program specification allows for a natural progression from one stage to the next. Specifically, there is a clear pathway for students who wish to progress from the two year Diploma to the proposed BA.
