



Η επιτροπή μελέτησε προσεκτικά την αίτηση και όλα τα έγγραφα που της δόθηκαν ως συνημμένα και συνέταξε την παρούσα έκθεση συμπληρώνοντας τα κεφάλαια 1-5, ενώ τα κεφάλαια 6-8 δεν συμπληρώθηκαν, διότι δεν εφαρμόζονται στο υπό αξιολόγηση πρόγραμμα.

Κατά τη διάρκεια της επίσκεψης στο κολλέγιο έγινε παρατήρηση όλων των χώρων (υποδοχή, αιθουσών, εργαστηρίων, κοινόχρηστων χώρων, βιβλιοθήκη κτλ.). Έγινε συνάντηση με εκπροσώπους από την ιεραρχία του κολλεγίου, την επιτροπή εσωτερικής ποιότητας, το διδακτικό προσωπικό, το διοικητικό προσωπικό και σπουδαστές του πτυχίου Αισθητικής & Κοσμητολογίας που ήδη λειτουργεί. Επίσης ζητήθηκαν διευκρινήσεις για συγκεκριμένα σημεία της αίτησης.

Το προσωπικό του κολλεγίου ήταν συνεργάσιμο και έδειξε ενδιαφέρον για βελτίωση που θα προκύψει από τα σχόλια της Επιτροπής.

Από την μελέτη του υλικού που δόθηκε από τον Φορέα στην Επιτροπή και από την επιτόπια επίσκεψη που πραγματοποιήθηκε, διαπιστώνεται ότι:

- το περιεχόμενο του προγράμματος, οι μέθοδοι αξιολόγησης, το διδακτικό υλικό και ο εξοπλισμός, αναμένεται να εξασφαλίζουν την επίτευξη του σκοπού, των στόχων και των μαθησιακών αποτελεσμάτων του προγράμματος

- τα αναμενόμενα μαθησιακά αποτελέσματα του προγράμματος θα είναι γνωστά στους σπουδαστές και στα μέλη του διδακτικού προσωπικού και η διαδικασία διδασκαλίας και μάθησης θα είναι επαρκής για την επίτευξή τους

- εφαρμόζεται το σύστημα ECTS και υπάρχει ορθολογική σχέση μεταξύ των credits και του φόρτου εργασίας

- το δίπλωμα που απονέμεται, αναμένεται να αντιστοιχεί στον σκοπό, τους στόχους και τα μαθησιακά αποτελέσματα του προγράμματος
