INTRODUCTION:

I. The External Evaluation procedure

- Short description of the documents that have been studied, of the on site visit meetings, and of the on site visit to the infrastructures.
- a) During the on site visit meetings, the committee received a printed description presenting :
- the School's structure, including the program in the proper position, i.e. by indicating the School and the Department under which the program will operate
 - the curriculum (allocation of courses per semester, weekly content of each course, teaching methodology, teaching material, evaluation, samples of papers, samples of written examinations, admission criteria for prospective students, etc.).
 - the academic/teaching staff (academic qualifications, publications, research interests, research activity etc.) and their relationship with the institution as teachers in connection with any other duties they may have in the institution or/and other programs.
 - Two Power Point documents were used to present us the main information and complementary points of view on the general situation of Cyprus (history, demography) and on the history of the university and a short one was used to present the Erasmus program.
- b) During the on site visit of the infrastructures, the committee received a small documentation on the new library and the brochure which present the university to the public in Greek and English.

II. The Internal Evaluation procedure

- *Comments concerning the quality and the completeness of the application submitted by the institution of higher education (Doc. Number 200.1), as well as concerning the overall acceptance of and participation in the quality assurance procedures, by the institution in general and by the program of study under evaluation in particular.*

The application could have been more synthesized and more clearly organized. It could have detailed more precisely the elements of the program like skills, methods, but the meetings were very helpful because they allowed the committee to get all the information regarding the program showing at the same time a loyal participation to the quality of procedure.

FINDINGS:

1. EFFECTIVENESS OF TEACHING WORK – AVAILABLE RESOURCES

The teaching staff is composed of two professors and three associate professors helped by two assistants. Another professor is going to arrive. He has already been chosen.

Invited professors help the regular team.

The team was much more numerous years ago before the crisis had negative effects on the department (which lost five teaching staff) with the consequence of an excessive amount of work for the regular staff, who has to face:

Four tracks for four years (only for the bachelor):

- a) European Studies
 - French and English
 - French and German
 - English and German
- b) French studies

The same staff has to take care of two masters and two Ph.D programs.
All the more remarkable how satisfied students are with the courses taught.

c)

The program is offered in the form of parallel courses per semester; it might be considered to transform it in a modular program which would be very handy as it makes the building of the structure and its sequences much easier.

2. PROGRAM OF STUDY AND HIGHER EDUCATION QUALIFICATIONS

a. Purpose and Objectives and learning outcomes of the Program of Study

The French Language and Literature track allows students to develop high-level skills to communicate in French, and to study in depth French linguistics on the one hand, and the specificity of this culture on the other (philosophy, literature and arts) which has crossed the borders of France.

Students in the Modern Languages and European Studies track will develop advanced skills in French and/or English and/or German and study European thought and culture in depth. At the end of their studies, they will have acquired knowledge in the humanities and social sciences, political science, law and the arts, and will be able to formulate constructive criticism of the society in which they will be living.

b. Structure and Content of the Program of studies

c. The BA has an eight-semester structure, which can be done in four years, and the maximum is six years.

The length of the BA (8 semesters) is due to a national decision with a view to the insufficiencies of secondary formation in high school especially with foreign languages.

The committee underlines that an 8 semesters BA can create adaptation problems with many other European universities.

Students can spend one or two semesters abroad inside the ERASMUS program which counts also in terms of ECTS.

c. Quality Assurance of the Program of studies

The quality assurance of the program studies is fourth fold evaluated.

- a) Teaching is evaluated at the end of each semester; the teaching personnel is evaluated by the students who fill in special questionnaires about the teaching of the course. These questionnaires are then processed by the Centre for Teaching and Learning (CTL).
- b) For academic matters the Department's Committee on Undergraduate Affairs submits to its Department's Council any changes/revisions on current study programs and proposals for developing new programs or even abolishing existing ones on the basis of new needs that arise.
- c) All suggestions made by the Departments on academic matters are approved by the Senate of the University of Cyprus.

- d) The evaluation of the study programs is conducted within the broader framework of the External Developmental Evaluation which takes place every five years.

If, on the one hand, these procedures are the guarantee of a well evaluated program, on the other hand, they make for a heavy system which could be a burden for the staff, while slowing down evolution and adaptation to new situations.

d. Management of the Program of Study

The program is managed by the Professor Yiannis E. Ioannou, Chairman of the Department and by the Assistant Professor Fryni Kakoyianni-Doa. The separate courses are executed by the professors and assistant professors who teach the courses. Because the group of teachers is relatively small, the management of the program can be organized in a community style. The students told the committee they were very happy with a atmosphere.

e. International Dimension of the Program of Study

The international dimension rests on the very content of the program itself which implies international orientation and interest for European cultures and on a dynamic international policy of cooperation with other universities (French, Swiss, Germany, Belgian, Lebanon, Greece...) besides attention with ERASMUS program.

During the fall semester 2018-19, eight students came from abroad through ERASMUS and five left for one or two semesters.

The program helps financially the students to take part in small summer seminars in foreign universities

f. Connection with the labor market and the society

The bachelor allows to work in various domains :

- First of all : national education – 90 % of them, but also :
- Public administration
- Cultural Institutions
- Diplomacy
- Professional translation
- Tourism
- Flight companies

- Media, communications and journalism
- International Organizations
- Research centers

3. RESEARCH WORK AND SYNERGIES WITH TEACHING (Research Teaching Synergies)

Because of the heavy teaching load, there is no other way for the teaching staff but to integrate their research in their courses if they still want to publish. The program is very interdisciplinary – some courses involve linguistics, philosophy, psychology, sociology, history, geography, gender studies.

The originality of such research has been recognized by European institutions: program C.o.n.t.a.c.t, and the attribution of the Jean Monnet Chair which also involves public lectures outside the academia.

The program needs professors of other departments who work in synergy with the main staff.

4. ADMINISTRATION SERVICES, STUDENT WELFARE AND SUPPORT OF TEACHING WORK

- a) Administrative mechanisms : all in accord with national Cypriot laws and standards.
- b) Infrastructures / Support
 - *Personal infrastructure*: the administrative staff should be composed of two secretaries as before. But, for the moment only one is available, which means a big amount of work, and extra hours which are got remunerated.
 - *Material infrastructure*:
The building of the department is brand new, even luxurious, with huge offices and nice conference rooms with all modern equipment. Classrooms are equipped with video, Wi-Fi, the furniture is brand new.
 - *Welfare of students*:

The University of Cyprus offers free psychological support and counselling services to all students through the Psychological Support Centre (PSC). The prime aim of this service is to contribute to students' welfare in order to ensure that they have the best possible experience during their studies and thereafter.

The Career Office operates as a link between the students of the University of Cyprus and the labour market.

The Health and Safety Department handles all issues related to the health and safety of the University Community.

- A number of student clubs complement life on Campus and enable students to engage in extracurricular activities and hobbies.
- The Career Office operates as a link between the students of the University of Cyprus and the labour market.

The University of Cyprus's ultra-modern Sports Centre aims at developing sport throughout the University Community.

The University runs Student Halls which consist of 12 buildings with a total capacity of 208 single rooms for more than 10 000 students. Extra efforts are to be made for Erasmus students.

- c) One of the main trumps of the Campus is the brand new ultra-modern library *Stelios Ionanou* built by Jean Nouvel, with a 600 000 books collection and a lot of accommodations for the student (individual work, collective study) and for the public. A reading room is opened 24 hours a day. There is a room dedicated to effective connection with the E.U databases.

g. Financial Resources

As a national university, the University of Cyprus has public resources and partially relays to the student fees/ amount of students.

6. DOCTORAL PROGRAMS OF STUDY

Two doctoral programs are possible, which are directly related to the BA:

- One allows students to carry on French Studies through didactics of French as a foreign language
- The other one is devoted to European Studies with a main emphasis on cultural perspectives.

CONCLUSIONS AND SUGGESTIONS OF THE EXTERNAL EVALUATION COMMITTEE¹

Academic qualities of the staff and personal involvement and engagement are very high. A good atmosphere prevails between the academic staff, the students and the administrative staff. The leading practices are good, as is the coherence of the program.

¹ It is highlighted, at this point, that the External Evaluation Committee is expected to justify its findings and its suggestions on the basis of the Document num.: 300.1. The External Evaluation Committee is not expected to submit a suggestion for the approval or the rejection of the program of study under evaluation. This decision falls under the competencies of the Council of the Agency of Quality Assurance and Accreditation of higher education.

Some of the courses are quite interesting and inspiring, especially when they are connected with research.

The amount of publications of the academic staff is quite impressive and the new library is a very important asset.

The number of students which obtain good marks at the Pancyprian exams, is increasing, due to the good reputation of the department in Cyprus and abroad, programs and a very efficient policy of public relations, especially through visiting all the high schools of the Island.

As the main part of the staff, especially the full professors, is composed of French Literature and Linguistics professors, the committee suggests recruiting new teaching staff to strengthen the European Studies dimension of the program in order to balance it. The German part of the program is under the responsibility of a teacher sent by the DAAD. A better solution would be to recruit a German *Dozent*.

The committee suggests that there should be more attention to methods and theoretical approaches.

There could be more Romanic dimension by opening Spanish and Italian tracks.

As a general conclusion, the committee strongly recommends to attract more administrative and academic staff and to develop the Mediterranean dimension of the European program to create a real niche inside European Studies.



FINAL REMARKS – SUGGESTIONS

Academic qualities of the staff and personal involvement and engagement are very high. A good atmosphere prevails between the academic staff, the students and the administrative staff. The leading practices are good, as is the coherence of the program.

Some of the courses are quite interesting and inspiring, especially when they are connected with research.

The amount of publications of the academic staff is quite impressive and the new library is a very important asset.

The number of students which obtain good marks at the Pancyprian exams, is increasing, due to the good reputation of the department in Cyprus and abroad, programs and a very efficient policy of public relations, especially through visiting all the high schools of the Island.

As the main part of the staff, especially the full professors, is composed of French Literature and Linguistics professors, the committee suggests recruiting new teaching staff to strengthen the European Studies dimension of the program in order to balance it. The German part of the program is under the responsibility

of a teacher sent by the DAAD. A better solution would be to recruit a German *Dozent*.

The committee suggests that there should be more attention to methods and theoretical approaches.

There could be more Romanic dimension by opening Spanish and Italian tracks.

As a general conclusion, the committee strongly recommends to attract more administrative and academic staff and to develop the Mediterranean dimension of the European program to create a real niche inside European Studies.
