The quality of the Team is excellent with impressive recent appointments, ref 1.3.11 Care needs to be taken that the Coordinator's workload is shared amongst new staff. The provision for the Team's contribution to research writing and practice and contribution to Society is exemplary.

It is very important that the University's commitment to appoint new staff set out in Table 4 pp 43-45 is met in full. In addition, the Panel were concerned that there is adequate provision for technical support in the workshops and studios to make these spaces operational and safe. The requirement is for 3 full-time posts (1 x technical support/Lab Assistant in Printmaking/photography, 1 x technical support/Lab Assistant in 3D, 1 x technical support/Lab Assistant in 2D).

A great deal of thought and care has gone into devising the detail of the Programme. As new subject specialists join the Team, they will bring their expertise to bear on developing and refining the curricula/Programme further. The Panel discussed at length the relative weightings of the various courses and the balance between theory and practice and have confidence in the way this has been planned. However, as with all new programmes, the Team will need to assess the Programme structure carefully at appropriate moments.





2.2.2 The Panel understood the increased ECTS weighting in the Third and Final Year studio courses to reflect students' increasing specialization and independent learning. As the Programme develops (and these courses will come on-stream from 2020) the Team may need to refine the assessment criteria in relation to the increasing ECTS weighting in these later stages of the Programme.

4.2.1. The Panel felt there is a need for increased investment in Library resources and related learning and research skills training. The document provided detailing library support was encouraging. The Panel commends the provision of a Subject Librarian and library tools, but felt the latter could be expanded and embedded into teaching strategies.

There is a need for more artists' monographs and subscriptions to leading international art magazines. We noted that there is good online availability of academic art journals.

4.2.3 The Panel were encouraged by our visit to the ongoing building works. The success of the Programme is fully dependent on the further planned Buildings 2 and 3 being completed on time and to the required specifications.

FINAL REMARKS – SUGGESTIONS

The Panel fully supports the initiative of launching the new Fine Art Programme, the first in a public university in Cyprus. There are ambitious but realizable plans in place. An excellent Team is being put in place to deliver on these plans.

Physical and human resources have been carefully structured to allow the Programme to develop as student numbers increase. We felt that alongside the planned academic appointments, technical/lab support is essential.

This is an ambitious new programme. With regard to teaching and learning, the Team have developed a very full end exciting curriculum. There should be a structure (outside that laid down by the formal requirements of the University) whereby the Team can evaluate and review provision to ensure that the components of the Programme, including teaching in art theory and practice are in balance and that there is space and time for the students to develop their own practices and reach their full academic potential.

We particularly commend:

- The energy and commitment demonstrated by the current Programme Coordiantor in bringing the Programme to the point where it is ready to recruit students
- Outstanding new professorial appointments.
- The ambitions and scope articulated in the documents we were provided with, particularly with regard to the way the Department will be positioned in the City, nationally and internationally.
- The thoroughness and commitment demonstrated by the Team to the review process.
- The support of the University in delivering on plans for resourcing the new Programme with staff, buildings and infrastructure.
- plans to make the Programme internationally facing

Recommendations:





- All planned appointments should be made as planned.
- Requirements for technical/laboratory support should be given further thought and the necessary appointments prioritized.
- The planned buildings should be completed as planned.
- Library resources should be strengthened

Matters for consideration:

- Further thought might be given to developing fuller assessment criteria for the practice-based courses and ensuring that there is transparency in assessment methods across different modes of study.
- Student workload, particularly in the first two years of study should be carefully monitored. The Team may wish to consider reducing the volume of courses/increasing the ECTS for given courses.
- In the later of the Programme, curriculum developments that emphasize employability/careers open to Fine Art students may be considered.
- Further consideration should be given to the development of postgraduate pathways in the subject.

The development of this new programme is undoubtedly an exciting opportunity for the University, for Limassol and for Cyprus. It will be particularly welcomed by those students who wish to study Fine Art in a public university in Cyprus who have hitherto not had this opportunity. Its arrival is also more broadly welcomed by the international Fine Art academic community. As with all new programmes, the Team may anticipate that opportunities and threats will come into view. We have every confidence in their capacity and energy to deal with these and with the continued support of the University. We wish the Fine Art Department every success in the future.
