INTRODUCTION:

I. The External Evaluation procedure

• Short description of the documents that have been studied, of the onsite visit meetings, and of the onsite visit to the infrastructures.

The committee studied beforehand the application for evaluation and accreditation of the program of study Doctor of philosophy in theology (Ph.D) submitted by University of Nicosia. On Tuesday 27/06/2017 the committee visited the facilities of the university of Nicosia, where we met the president of the university, the members of Academic Staff and two candidates. The committee also visited the labs, classrooms, the lecture hall and the cafeteria, and had an overall view of the institution. Most of members of the staff we are present and they were eager to share the information needed and requested.

II. The Internal Evaluation procedure

• Comments concerning the quality and the completeness of the application submitted by the institution of higher education (Doc. Number 200.1), as well as concerning the overall acceptance of and participation in the quality assurance procedures, by the institution in general and by the program of study under evaluation in particular.

The document was well elaborated. Most of the questions were answered, although some of them needed to be cleared out. The document shows that the university has an active department for program quality assurance.





FINDINGS:

1. EFFECTIVENESS OF TEACHING WORK – AVAILABLE RESOURCES

Organization of Teaching Work

Regarding organization of teaching work, admission policy is not as clear as needed, for example, anyone without theological qualifications may follow postgraduate theological studies. The information was not available in the application.

There was no clear schedule of meetings between students and professors, and this is particularly difficult because many professors live abroad.

Regarding the enhancement of students' participation in the procedures for the improvement of their educational process, the evaluation committee wishes for a feedback form and procedure that is specific and anonymous.

The library for the program is not located in the central campus. Students' accessibility to printed books is questionable.

Teaching

PhD Students should be able to present their own investigations in seminars and public presentations. The evaluation committee recommends the implementation of common colloquia, where students may present the development of their work and discuss with their professors and colleagues.

Teaching personnel

From 11 professors mentioned on p. 35 of the application report, only 3 are residents in Cyprus. 4 are in Thessalonica and other 4 in Athens. Only the three residents in Nicosia are fully engaged with the program in Cyprus. The committee is worried about the effectiveness of the support they can deliver because of distances and their condition as emeriti professors.

The evaluation committee recommends the recruitment of the teaching staff with young scholars from different international backgrounds, particularly from Middle East, Eastern Europe and Diaspora, for improving communication with students and for the use of updated technology. It has been observed the absence of women among faculty members.





2. PROGRAM OF STUDY AND HIGHER EDUCATION QUALIFICATIONS

Purpose and Objectives and learning outcomes of the Program of Study

The evaluation committee recommends the reformulation of objectives and Learning outcomes taking into consideration the skills and competences acquired after the fulfillment of the program.

Structure and Content of the Program of studies

The correspondence between credits and workload is not clear enough in the submitted documentation.

For an adequate learning of a PhD program in Theology previous theological studies should be a requisite. It can be considered to rename the program into a PhD in Orthodox studies, which does not necessarily imply a deep knowledge of theological specialized fields.

During the visit, the committee did not observe special facilities for students with special needs (for instance ramps and toilets for wheelchair users)

Quality Assurance of the Program of studies

The University of Nicosia has clear policy and an active unit for quality assurance of PhD programs that make an effective follow up of the academic activity.

Management of the Program of Study

The evaluation committee recommends the review of the admission policies according to what was written above in "Structure and Content of the Program of studies".

Regarding the transfer of credit system, if the HE institution implements seminars, colloquia and workshops for this program, the recognition and transfer of credits may be available.

International Dimension of the Program of Study

The Evaluation committee recommends better cooperation activities with Europe and the MENA region to attract students and visiting faculty from a broader international profile.

Connection with the labor market and the society

Concerning the labor market, A PhD in theology does not necessarily improve employability. However, a PhD in theology can improve the quality of work of the already working graduates.

In society and within the framework of migration streams and the revival of fundamentalism, there is a strong need for a theologically inspired humanistic engagement.





3. RESEARCH WORK AND SYNERGIES WITH TEACHING

Research Teaching Synergies

With the eventual presence of younger researchers, the fundraising for research activities locally and abroad would be more appropriate.

4. ADMINISTRATION SERVICES, STUDENT WELFARE AND SUPPORT OF TEACHING WORK

Administrative Mechanisms

The University of Nicosia offers excellent administrative services for student welfare and support of teaching work.

Infrastructures / Support

Training courses on teaching methods are compulsory for all faculty members at UNIC, something that improves the quality of teaching work.

Financial Resources

Information was not available neither in documents nor in the interviews.

5. DISTANCE LEARNING PROGRAMS

Not applicable for this program.

6. DOCTORAL PROGRAMS OF STUDY

In the meeting, a report on adherence to DIAPE Guidelines for doctoral Degree Programs was submitted to the evaluation committee members.

According to the application, the program is very much concentrated on the Dissertation alone. The program needs modules of colloquia and seminars to improve the learning process.





CONCLUSIONS AND SUGGESTIONS OF THE EXTERNAL EVALUATION COMMITTEE $^{\rm 1}$

• The present situation of the program, good practices, weaknesses that have been detected during the external evaluation procedure by the external evaluation committee, suggestions for improvement.

The documentation available for the Evaluation committee before and during the site visit give consistent and clear information about the program. Based on the evidence, the interviews and the site visit, the evaluation committee recommends:

- The review of the admission conditions, so that students have theological qualifications to accomplish their doctoral studies successfully.
- The enrichment of the faculty team with female members and with variety of nationalities and languages within the orthodox world. for instance, Arabic from MENA and Russia from Eastern Europe, besides the diaspora languages.
- The improvement of the rate between resident and permanent faculty members. Now the rate is 3 to 8 and it could be improved into 5 to 8.
- The incorporation of younger generations among the distinguished contemporary Orthodox thinkers.
- Including the library facilities within the campus
- A better balance between program objectives and program Learning outcomes taking into consideration the skills and competences acquired after the fulfillment of the program.
- Including modules of seminars and colloquia for the students to present and discuss the development of their work with their professors and colleagues.
- Encouraging Doctor students to publish at least 2 scientific articles in peerreviewed journals before completion of studies.

FINAL REMARKS – SUGGESTIONS

The documentation available for the Evaluation committee before and during the site visit give consistent and clear information about the program. Based on the evidence, the interviews and the site visit, the evaluation committee recommends:

- The review of the admission conditions, so that students have theological qualifications to accomplish their doctoral studies successfully.
- The enrichment of the faculty team with female members and with variety of nationalities and languages within the orthodox world. for instance, Arabic from MENA and Russia from Eastern Europe, besides the diaspora languages.
- The improvement of the rate between resident and permanent faculty members. Now the rate is 3 to 8 and it could be improved into 5 to 8.
- The incorporation of younger generations among the distinguished contemporary Orthodox thinkers.
- Including the library facilities within the campus
- A better balance between program objectives and program Learning outcomes taking into consideration the skills and competences acquired after the fulfillment of the program.
- Including modules of seminars and colloquia for the students to present and discuss the development of their work with their professors and colleagues.
- Encouraging Doctor students to publish at least 2 scientific articles in peer-reviewed journals before completion of studies.
