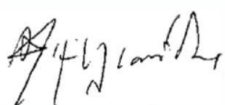
Subject: Response to the Professional Body Report – Law LLB, University of Nicosia

We thank the Representative of the Cyprus Bar Association regarding their specific observations related to the legislation governing the profession.

We note that it is confirmed that the program contains all the relevant courses as well as a large number of electives, and that the application provides a detailed overview of each course offered and the objectives of the program are clearly outlined. It is further confirmed that the program provides the students the legal knowledge to meet the challenges encountered in the labour market and provides them with skills for them being able to work as lawyers. Upon completion of the program, students will be eligible to register as trainee lawyers.

With regards to the comment that it would be beneficial to further strengthen the practical dimension of the curriculum, we have addressed this comment also in our Reply. We concur with this recommendation of the EEC, which is forward-looking. We confirm that we have introduced already court visits and observation of judicial proceedings as part of courses, and we have introduced also a new Practicum course as an elective course, which will be done in accordance with the existing regulations of the University regarding practicums. We have introduced practical aspects, such as drafting of legal documents and mock trials, especially as part of the Advanced Courses, which are offered in the fourth year of studies. In all, we agree that this is also an important recommendation, and we will ensure that this is implemented in practice in the best possible way.
